MINISTRY OF FINANCE AND STEWARDSHIP [MOFS]

PER CAPITA..., It's the amount St Paul contributes annually to Denver Presbytery in support of the work of our denomination. Per Capita for 2025 is \$32 for each of St Paul's 115 members. The Session recently approved \$3,680 from the general operating budget to fulfill our 2025 obligation, holding the faith that each member will donate as they are able. In 2024 to offset the expense to the church's budget, 76 of St Paul's members were able to share in this commitment and it is hoped that more members will be able and are moved to participate this year.

Denver Presbytery, in the way of direct grants and loan forgiveness to St Paul, has given much more than we've contributed through the years. As an example: prior to our insurance settlements Presbytery provided \$75,000 allowing us to pay vendors and move forward with repairs after last year's water damage; most recently we were awarded a \$10,000 grant to assist with escalating Board of Pension dues which severely impact our operating costs. These grants and other financial assistance have enabled us to improve our church facility, meet emergency repair needs and provide for the ongoing needs of our community.

Once again, our 2025 budgeted Per Capita is \$3,680 (\$32.00 per member) and we humbly ask that you consider contributing as you are able. This amount from each member is beyond any amount you may have pledged. Per Capita envelopes will be waiting for you in the Narthex, and we thank you for your consideration.

STPPC Food Pantry February 6, 2025



Hi all! I need help. Running the food pantry is challenging and I would like to travel more. The job description is at the very end of the newsletter. Please see Sue Shaw if you have any questions.

STPPC Food Pantry is now computerized versus our previous paper and pencil attendance. Clients bring their card assigned by Food Bank of the Rockies or our pantry, the cards are scanned and attendance is taken. Nifty, skippy.

Link2Feed counts attendance by families. For January, 40 families per week on average have been served. Our numbers have dropped a little. Not sure of the reason: it could be the immigration issue since more information is required and has been computerized.

Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR) sent out 2 notices that will affect the pantry due to the new administration. First, ICE visits. FBR recommends complete compliance. Second, Federal grants supplementing food purchased have been put on hold. Food purchases will cost more.



Tuesday, February 11, Valentine candy will be shared with the clients. Drop a bag of candy by the food pantry door if you want to join.

As always, volunteers are needed for every other Monday FBR pickup, Tuesday distribution, and Sunday bag packing. Here is the link to sign up for Monday and Tuesday online. FP Volunteer Signup

PS—The food pantry is out of bags and boxes. If you have shopping bags, paper bags, or small boxes, it will help!

STPPC Food Pantry Job Description January 29, 2025

TO DO: Training from Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR). How to order food from FBR. Review the warehouse. Review funding. Receive username and password to log in to FBR—partner portal.

Keep track of food pantry account balance. If account runs low, decide how to increase balance. Member of the Daily Bread Mission Project through Denver Presbytery. This requires quarterly meetings. Denver Presbytery issues us money through this collaboration. Also, apply for other monies as available. St. Michaels Catholic Church usually gives us money. There are a lot of volunteers from St. Michaels. There are other grants available.

Thanksgiving extras, Christmas extras, other holidays. No religious comments due to FBR guidelines.

Pick up food from Food Bank of the Rockies every other Monday.

On Friday after Monday pickup, go on Food Bank of the Rockies website to reserve a pickup time. This is so the pickup time is at 9 am. If you wait, pick up time is later in the day. Our volunteers like to pick up early and get on with the day.

Every Tuesday, STPPC Food Pantry distributes boxes through the drive-thru from 10 to 12. Get to church shortly after 9 to prepare for the day. Volunteers usually come around 9:45. Extra items are added to boxes and other miscellaneous activities. Using Link2Feed (an FBR program that computerizes attendance). Using personal Chromebook to access Link2Feed.

Sunday after church, boxes are packed by STPPC congregation. Boxes contain: 1 peanut butter, 2 soups, 1 shelf stable milk, 2 vegetables, 2 beans, 2 proteins (chicken), 1 pasta, 1 rice, 1 cereal (usually oatmeal—heathy and fits in boxes)

When special deals are available at FBR, I purchase them. Eggs are purchased whenever available.

Approximately 6 months of the year, Girl Scout Cookie boxes are given out to our clients. The boxes are used to pack the food.

Boxes cost about \$0.80 each—it saves money to use Girl Scout boxes, sacks, and probably 1/3 of our boxes are returned.

Example: Monday, January 20, FBR Pickup

Tuesday, January 21, Food Distribution using Link2Feed

Friday, January 24, log in to FBR to reserve pickup time for February 3

Tuesday, January 28, after food pantry—inventory

Thursday, January 30, before 3 place order with FBR (this week was *Wednesday, January 29* before 3 because FBR is closed January 31, and they need 3 days to fill

order)

Either Sunday or Monday before delivery, the shelves are condensed. Current food must be moved to the front of the shelves and dated. Old food must be used before the new items. FBR requirement.

Client Newsletter was created at the beginning of the month. Remind clients of other food pantries. Resources for diapers, pet food, Mile High United Way and other resources.

Every other week, create a news article for the STPPC Newsletter. The STPPC Food Pantry is a mission project of St. Paul Presbyterian Church. Our responsibility it to keep the congregation apprised of the STPPC Food Pantry status.
