Conspiring to Build Courageous Relationships / Leadership Summit

News from Session:

Session is calling a special meeting of the congregation on Sunday, February 23, following worship, to receive a recommendation from Session concerning an opportunity to sell 1.65 acres of land, previously agreed upon by the congregation to list for sale.

We have received an offer of \$395,000 for this parcel. The buyer proposes at their cost, to conduct a survey and seek approval from the City of Aurora to separate these 1.65 acres from St. Paul's property for future development. After separation, the buyer plans to develop the new parcel in compliance with City of Aurora zoning and building codes. Currently our property is zoned R2 which limits development to single family units and certain attached housing units. The developer clearly understands the current zoning requirements. The previous offer we received last year was turned down as the developer was imposing a number of unacceptable conditions to the sale that adversely affected St. Paul.

Session believes that accepting this offer would provide significant financial security for St. Paul by reducing our mortgage and giving us additional funding for our current programs.

TRANSITIONAL TEAM A great opportunity to be involved in what happens next at St. Paul

On Thursday evening, February 13th, Session met with a representative of the Presbytery's Ministry Relations Committee. One of the first steps they suggested for us is to create a Transitional Team. This group of approximately six people will be responsible for overseeing this time of transition. This would include gathering input and information from the congregation to help determine what direction St. Paul would like to go and, based on that, what we would like to see in our next pastor. When the new pastor comes, this group would then meet with her or him for a period of time to continue to help make the transition go smoothly. Ideally, this team would include 2 elders, 2 deacons, and 2 members at large. If you think you might like to be a part of this very important group, please see Dave Goss or Pastor Kim. Please note – this team is NOT the same as the Pastor Nominating Committee. The roles are different, although the Pastor Nominating Committee will benefit from the work the Transitional Team does.

This is Food Bank of the Rockies lates update on federal support:

While there are many unknowns at the federal level, I want to assure you that Food Bank of the Rockies is actively working to ensure as little disruption as possible to the food and resources you receive. As background, Food Bank of the Rockies partners with the federal government to administer the following programs: The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP), Commodity Supplemental Food Program (Everyday Eats), Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), The Local Food Purchase Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program (LFPA), Summer Food Service Program (SUN Meals), Child and Adult Care Food Program, and SNAP Outreach. These programs make up approximately 15% of Food Bank of the Rockies' funding and 20% of our overall budget, including food distributed. Like you, we are deeply concerned about potential impacts to the neighbors we serve.
