NAKAI MISSION PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

The Nakai Mission Partnership is one of the 3 Denver Presbytery mission partnerships in which St. Paul participates. The purpose of this mission partnership is to provide health care for women in Zimbabwe – in particular – cancer screening and treatment. Last year Nakai provided scholarships for 20 individuals to attend a Nurse's Aide training program put on by the Red Cross in Zimbabwe. We are happy to share that all 20 of those individuals graduated and are now certified. If they desire, they can now go on to university to become nurses, which is paid for by the government. The 20 graduates are meeting with the Nakai team in Zimbabwe this Saturday to discuss a group they are calling Health Champions. In return for the opportunity they have been given, at least some of these graduates will provide needed health care within the presbytery of Zimbabwe. This also gives the graduates an opportunity to earn a living as nurse's aides. We believe this scholarship program is a program of empowerment. We have received a number of photos and thank you messages. One says: I just wanted to send you my heartfelt thank you to you and your team. May God bless you all abundantly for your support. I am now empowered on a health pedestal. Thank you very, very much.





News from Session:

At the March 13 Session meeting, Rev. David Hogue of the Presbytery's Ministry Relations Committee (MRC) was introduced as our liaison with Presbytery for the upcoming pastor search process. David then outlined a number of points for all to consider and explained how the transition team will work:

- This is a process of discernment and sacred work.
- Prayers and reflections are part of the work.
- Eventually the PNC will be elected by the congregation.
- Part of the process is to determine what St. Paul is today and what is it called to become.
- There is usually an interim pastor before calling the next installed pastor but there may be other options.
- The transition team will do most of the preparatory work for the PNC (the 12 questions "mission study")
- Session will review and approve the responses to the 12 questions before submittal to Presbytery.

Session introduced the recently appointed Pastor Search transition team to David, They are Pam Jones (Chair), Shirey Younger, Ellen Ingram; Joann Goss; Matthew Gobla, Cleve Dixon and Don Allensworth. This team will work closely with the congregation in gathering information about St. Paul and helping us to decide what we need in pastoral leadership for the next pastor.

True Light will hold their Vacation Bible School over three days, May 28, 29 and 30 at St. Paul using most of the building and has extended an invitation to St. Paul children to participate as well. St. Paul's Vacation Bible School will be held on May 31st from about 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Mile High Fellowship will not be at St. Paul that day.

A new computer and monitor will soon be installed in the library and the old library computer moved to the office and upgraded to Windows 11 software.

A clipboard is now mounted on the wall in the workroom underneath the key safe. If anyone has concerns about the building, repairs or supplies needed, please enter that information on the clipboard with your name and date.

Update on property sale. The buyers have placed \$25,000 in escrow in anticipation of the completion of the sale. They have approximately six-months to complete the separation of St. Paul's property from the property they are buying. If necessary, an increase in the time required for the separation can be extended. Once complete, the developers alone will be working with the City of Aurora on their parcel.

The Aurora Chief of Police Todd Chamberlain spoke on his vision for partnering with the community of faith. He asked that the group pray for the police. In Aurora, there are 1.6 police per 1000 people. Recommendations are 2 per 1000 people. There are 707 officers with the Aurora Police Department.

The Aurora Fire & Rescue also discussed Red Fire Alert Emergencies. Those emergencies are grass fires in Aurora.
