

The Kroger Community Rewards program sent us a check for \$173.34 on April 22, 2025, for the 1st quarter.

On Tuesday, March 6, 62 families were served. Since we are using Link2Feed, number of boxes distributed aren't counted but number of

families served. I would guess that 120 boxes were distributed. Average families served is 45 per Tuesday distribution.

Pickups will be on Monday, June 2, 16 and 30.

Cleve is still distributing Senior Boxes on the 2nd and 3rd Tuesday during regular pantry. Approximately 16 boxes are distributed to those over 60 who meet income requirements. The Senior Boxes are similar our boxes but have more items including cheese but are distributed only once a month.

The pantry always needs women's items. Also, soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste and bread are appreciated.
