News from Pastor:

My Dear Church Family,

This is one of the painful parts of leaving, but something that must be communicated. Monday, Dave Goss and I signed a Memorandum of Understanding from the Presbytery. It is a document that outlines the reason that a former pastor must not be available to the congregation after he/she leaves the church. I will share a few sentences with you:

- When a pastor leaves a church, there are bonds of affection between the minister and members of the church which continue to be cherished.
- For the health and welfare of the church, it is important that the former pastor and his/her family find another church to attend. The former pastor's continued presence in the life of the church almost always hinders the congregation and the incoming pastor in developing the necessary relationship for successful ministry.
- The former pastor shall avoid all conversation and communication with church members about the new pastor, as well as problems and issues regarding the former church.
- The former pastor shall avoid participation in funerals, weddings, baptisms, etc. for members of the former church.
- At all times, the former pastor should remain sensitive to possible tension that can arise from his/her presence in the former church. In short, church members should not request a former pastor to perform pastoral duties. If requested, the former pastor should tactfully decline.

I realize how difficult this is, as it is difficult for me also, but I also understand that it would be almost impossible for a new pastor to develop a good relationship with the congregation if I were still "around."

Please look back at the first bullet point. I will ALWAYS cherish you and the friendships I have developed (more about that in the next newsletter \odot). You will forever be a part of my heart and I will faithfully pray for you.

Kim Graber who will be retiring on June 29, 2025. The Book of Order requires that the congregation vote to dissolve the relationship when a pastor leaves for whatever reason.

Session is forming an Interim Pastor Search Committee to start working with Denver Presbytery to hire a pastor to serve as an interim at St. Paul following Kim's retirement. Three Elders and two other members of the congregation will be on this committee. Since Session hires the interim directly, there is not a long process for this search. Session expects the interim to be in place for the fall programs.

News From Our Service Ministries:

MINISTRY OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS [MBG]

Our trash contractor is now imposing "penalty" fees to our trash pickup invoices. These fees include two main areas, contamination of recycled materials and filling the dumpsters too full. Each penalty is \$75. For recycling, the following items CANNOT be recycled: plastic bags, Styrofoam and foam, food waste, greasy cardboard and paper, liquids, used napkins, paper towels and tissues, toner cartridges, electronics and cords, batteries, plastic cutlery and straws, poly-lined beverage cups and biodegradable or compostable plastics. Furthermore, recycled materials CANNOT be left in black plastic contractor bags in the dumpster. All recycled materials need to be emptied out of the plastic bag and the bag placed in the "trash" dumpster. Additionally, if waste or recycling materials exceeds the height of the rim preventing closure of the lids, then that is another \$75 penalty fee. If trash or recycling materials are on the ground, that may result in a penalty fee as well. These fees are widespread throughout the trash industry and not unique to our contractor. Both True Light and Mile High Fellowship have been notified of these penalty fees. We will post signs in the kitchen and Fellowship Hall noting these guidelines.

WHAT YOU CAN DO: A cart of miscellaneous items is set out for clients to take what they need. This includes items donated by you: feminine hygiene products, soap, shampoo, salt/pepper, not usual items (spinach, tuna, fancy soup, etc.) Please put your items in the grocery cart in the Narthex.

The pantry is still handing out Girl Scout cookies and probably will until the fall. The boxes are perfect for our items. Thank you, Girl Scouts.

Per Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR), the government has cut funding for Local Food Purchasing Program (LFPA) which will result in less fresh, nutritious food. Farmers and Ranchers will lose money because FBR is not purchasing their products.

This year has the highest number of people experiencing hunger in 10 years. Please go to the Food Bank of the Rockies website for additional information.
