We are very pleased to announce we have hired an office manager. Her name is Sirah Price and comes to us via a temp agency. She is very personable, friendly and eager to learn about the St. Paul family. Kim Graber, Gary Crownover and Pam Jones were the interview team and we were very impressed and comfortable with her. She is working 4 hours Monday through Thursday and is assisted by the office angels.

MINISTRY OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS [MBG]

Our trash contractor is now imposing "penalty" fees to our trash pickup invoices. These fees include two main areas, contamination of recycled materials and filling the dumpsters too full. Each penalty is \$75. For recycling, the following items CANNOT be recycled: plastic bags, Styrofoam and foam, food waste, greasy cardboard and paper, liquids, used napkins, paper towels and tissues, toner cartridges, electronics and cords, batteries, plastic cutlery and straws, poly-lined beverage cups and biodegradable or compostable plastics.

Furthermore, recycled materials CANNOT be left in black plastic contractor bags in the dumpster. All recycled materials need to be emptied out of the plastic bag and the bag placed in the "trash" dumpster. Additionally, if waste or recycling materials exceeds the height of the rim preventing closure of the lids, then that is another \$75 penalty fee. If trash or recycling materials are on the ground, that may result in a penalty fee as well. These fees are widespread throughout the trash industry and not unique to our contractor. Both True Light and Mile High Fellowship have been notified of these penalty fees. We will post signs in the kitchen and Fellowship Hall noting these guidelines.

Palisade Peach Sale to Support Zimbabwe Kidz Mission Partnership of the Presbytery of Denver



Each year St Paul Presbyterian Church participates in a fund raiser for "ZimKidz" by offering 20-pound boxes of delicious Palisade peaches. If you are new to St Paul you may not be familiar with what a mission partnership is. Mission partnerships may be formed when two or more sessions within the Presbytery wish to work together to address an identified need.

Zimbabwe Kidz was formed to raise finances for the education of children in Zimbabwe. The needs to be met are determined through communication with a subcommittee in the Presbytery of Zimbabwe and Zimbabwe Kidz Mission Partnership. Our main goal is to provide clean water at the Presbyterian schools that do not have clean water or churches that desire to have a pre-school program and are required to have clean water.

Participating churches are Green Mountain, St. Paul, St. James, and First Presbyterian Church of Littleton.

Orders may now be placed by speaking with Cleve Dixon, or by contacting the church office. The price per box is \$40.00, payable at the time of pickup by cash or check. The anticipated delivery is the last weekend in July or the first weekend of August, depending on the orchard grower notifying ZimKidz that the peaches are ready.

Please let us know how many boxes you can use before the last week of July. Feel free to ask your friends, neighbors, or coworkers. The more we sell, the more deep boreholes we can drill to bring clean water to thirsty children in Zimbabwe.

The STPPC Food Pantry balance is getting low. It looks like a lot of money, but that is all that is left for the rest of the calendar year and it goes fast at over \$2,000/month. I am expecting \$400 from 2 different donations in July. Please prayerfully consider donating to the food pantry. Your money goes further through the Food Bank of the Rockies.

Our boxes contain: 1 peanut butter, 2 soups, 1 shelf-stable milk, 2 cans vegetables, 2 cans beans, 2 cans chicken, 1 pasta, 1 rice, and 1 oatmeal. There are still Girl Scout Cookies to hand out—one of our clients just stops by for cookies! The boxes then hold the food we hand out. Approximately 1/3 of our boxes are returned.

Distribution

July 8	5 anonymous (9 individuals) plus 40 households (136 individuals)
July 1	10 Anonymous (37 individuals) plus 41 households (155 individuals)
June 24	7 anonymous (22 individuals) plus 37 households (133 individuals)
June 17	7 anonymous (20 individuals) plus 36 households (136 individuals)

(Anonymous are new clients who do not have Link2Feed Card.) As you can see, we have a client base of between 35 to 45 who show up weekly.

CSFP or Colorado Senior Food Program is handed out on the 2nd and 3rd Tuesday during regular food pantry. Cleve Dixon handles this program. On the 8th, Cleve handed out 11 Senior Boxes. Boxes will also be distributed next Tuesday.



Please bring your extra fresh produce to the church on SUNDAY for food pantry distribution on TUESDAY. Our clients love fresh produce.
