August is the time in Colorado when over 880,000 children and youth return to school in our state. Tens of thousands of teachers, administrators, counselors, school nurses, paraprofessionals, custodial staff, building secretaries, food service professionals, bus drivers, maintenance crews, crossing guards, volunteers, and more. Over 250,000 learners and corresponding instructional and support staff return to college campuses across Colorado as well. Parents, grandparents, and caregivers hunt for school supplies, figure out schedules, meet teachers, cram in last minute physicals, immunizations, or other appointments or tasks to help learners get ready to start the year. Often, churches, including St. Paul in years past, send learners and educational staff back to school with a blessing of the backpacks. St. Paul also sends school supplies out in the community to help bless children and families.

Please take a moment to remember what back to school has been like for you (now or in the past in any of the roles mentioned) and say a prayer for the students, families, and everyone in our communities involved in education as we start this new year of learning. If you have an extra pack of granola bars lying around to donate to the food pantry, that is appreciated as well.

News from Session:



St. Paul family, on Monday, August 11 we closed on the sale of the 1.65 acre parcel of land. The settlement of the sale is broken down as follows: Fees and utility charges - \$5,158; Payment to PILP for our current mortgage \$100,000 (which will leave a new balance of approximately \$190,000); payoff of


the \$60,000 special PILP loan was \$56,153.01 reducing that amount to Zero and a payment to our agent was \$25,000. MOFS will deposit the remaining \$208,688.99 into our long-term investments. As you may recall, Session determined that these proceeds would not be used for operating expenses. We appreciate your support and patience during this process. St. Paul now has some financial stability that will make us more attractive to a new pastor.
