

St Paul Presbyterian Church Food Pantry (part of MMO)



What a wild 2 months at Food Pantry!
October 21, 65 households served (261 people)
October 29, 69 households served (493 people)
November 4, 60 households served (219 people)
November 11, 74 households served (280 people)
November 18, 74 households served (273 people). This is due to SNAP benefits being cancelled.

Food Bank of the Rockies came out with grants that saved our butts. They gave us around \$7,000. This

amount covered our purchases for November and December. Then, St. Michael the Archangel Roman Catholic church brought food donations on Monday, December 1, after our food bank pickup.

On Monday, November 17, St. Michael's brought an even larger load of food donated by their congregation. After our trucks unloaded, St. Michael's showed up with lots of food. Chelsea Place, an Alzheimer's center, also brought in food on Monday, November 24. Because we had so much food and I had received notice of the grants from Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR), Thanksgiving bags were created on Tuesday, November 25, before the pantry. Approximately 28 bags were created with unique items donated. The Thanksgiving bags were in addition to the regular box received. Also, FBR gave us 15 gift cards for \$25 each. So, our clients on the 25th received the regular boxes and 43 families received extra.

REVERSE ADVENT

Each day add an item to a box or bag, then return the box to STPPC Food Pantry on Sunday, December 21 or donate \$25 to buy a box of food. Turn the money in on Sunday, December 14 to Sue Shaw marked Christmas Food Pantry.

- November 30 1 can soup (chicken noodle, tomato or vegetable)
- December 1 1 can soup (chicken noodle, tomato, or vegetable)
- December 2 1 small jar peanut butter
- December 3 1 box powdered milk or evaporated milk
- December 4 1 can pinto, black or kidney beans
- December 5 1 can black, kidney or pinto beans
- December 6 1 can vegetables (green beans, corn, mix veggies, peas)
- December 7 1 can vegetables (corn, green beans, peas, mixed veggies)
- December 8 1 small can chicken
- December 9 1 small can chicken
- December 10 1 bag pasta
- December 11 1 package rice
- December 12 1 regular size box cereal or oatmeal

**All the above is in a regular box. The items below are extra items if you choose to add them.

- December 13 Onions*
- December 14 Small bag potatoes*
- December 15 1 small bottle vegetable oil*
- December 16 salt and pepper*

December 21 TURN IN BOX

Your completed box will be handed out as a regular box to our clients. One of your boxes per car and then our standard boxes will be used to complete their order.

Christmas bags/boxes will be in addition to the regular box received.
