The World Communion Special Offering is October 4



The first Sunday in October has traditionally been a time to celebrate World Communion Sunday where Christians everywhere partake of the Lord's Supper. We are all God's children and siblings in Christ Jesus. We are one, as the hymn says:

*In Christ there is no East or West,
In Him no South or North,
But one great Fellowship of love,
Throughout the whole wide earth.*

Gifts to the World Communion Special Offering will be used for reconciliation ministries in the following areas:

Racial Justice, hoping to right the wrongs of the past, and restore what has been historically taken from indigenous communities and from people of color.

Gender Justice, working to bring LGBTQIA+ fully into our communities and promoting gender equity and empowerment to women worldwide.

Peacemaking, awarding grants to programs that seek to put an end to the epidemic of gun violence in our country.

Global Witness, connecting through Global Ecumenical Partnerships to bridge communities across the United States and around the world, connecting people and strengthening our understanding of new ways to engage in God's mission.

Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations, ecumenical and interreligious work is central to the gospel and key to the life of the Presbyterian Church (USA). A delegation from PC(USA) recently met with individuals and organizations in Jordan and Israel-Palestine who are providing ministry in their context as well as working on human rights and other deep needs in the region.

Over the remaining Sundays between now and World Communion Sunday on October 4th you will hear Minutes for Mission giving more information on these efforts. MMO hopes you will give prayerful thought to supporting this special offering.
